time. Over an extended playing time of 10 minutes each way the USA Owls and the Chepstow Cavaliers slogged it out. Whilst the first half provided an even contest, illustrated by the fact that the Cavaliers became the first team to cross the Owls try line, it ultimately became a trial of strength and fitness as the Owls moved up a gear to deliver the killing blow of two quick tries taking an unassailable lead.
