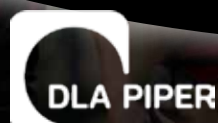

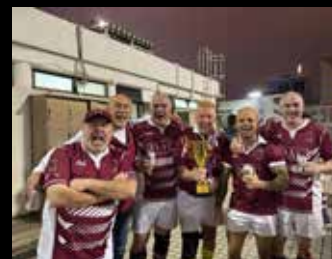

BVI

TEAM COLOURS: GREEN & WHITE



The British Virgin Island Rugby Football Union is excited to be returning to play in the 2025 DHL Kowloon RugbyFest after a gap of five years.

The team will consist of senior players and junior players from the islands' rugby programme as well as some Hong Kong based friends. The success of previous trips show that RugbyFest provides a fantastic opportunity to expose the younger members of BVI Rugby to a quality international rugby tournament and to play against some top class players as well as broadening their exposure to professional opportunities.

The British Virgin Islands is small country in the North Eastern Caribbean, with a population of about 30,000 people. Rugby began in the islands over fifty years ago, when a group of British, South African and Australian expats living on Tortola formed a team to play on a dirty, rocky pitch against a group of Royal Navy engineers who came to Islands to build the country's runway on Beef Island.

2018 saw BVI Rugby lift silverware in Kowloon for the first time in somewhat unusual circumstances. Since the team's last appearance in Kowloon, BVI has continued to improve its performances in the Rugby Americas North Sevens, including in games against recent Rugby Sevens World Cup qualifiers Canada and Jamaica. Other developments include the recruitment of a new full time Rugby Development Officer, and the introduction of our East versus West national championship.

This year the tour has been generously sponsored by Quantuma. Our thanks goes out to the organisers at Kowloon RFC and to our main sponsor EMCS.



Gaijin Grizzlies

The Gaijin Grizzlies are making their debut at the DHL Kowloon RugbyFest with its rugby-mad players drawn mainly from Japan where they play for the All France Rugby Club (<https://allfrancerugbyclub.com/about-us/>).

They train regularly in Takadanobaba, Tokyo and their obsession with the sport means they play all the year around while featuring in two championships: The traditional Japanese Shuto League and the Baird Beer Cup. The All France Rugby Club was founded just after the first ever Rugby World Cup, in July 1987 and draws its membership from a range of nationalities and professions. Social rugby is growing rapidly in Japan which has among the largest population of rugby union players in the world. The Nagas tour represents a unique opportunity for these players to deepen their development while serving as role models for the thousands of young players aged 11-16 across four provinces who are embracing rugby—for their love of the sport and for the access it provides to life and leadership skills, as well as the chance to form important peer networks. As Coaches and leaders of the sport in Lao PDR, these players are ambassadors for Lao Rugby both on and off the pitch. The DAC Lao Women's National Team has gone on to achieve some of the most historic victories in Lao Rugby's history, including the U17 Women's Youth Olympic Games team defeating Malaysia and the Philippines, and the Senior Women's National Team defeating Guam and Indonesia.
